It means 46% students goes to school & 81 students doesn't go to school. It means 54% students doesn't go to school.

CONCLUSION :

1. Out of 150 childrens only 26 students goes to school. It means 17% students studies in primary school.
2. Out of 150 childrens only 49 students goes to school. It means 32% students studies in secondary school.
3. Out of 150 only 3 students goes to secondary school. It means only 2% student studies in lower secondary school.
4. Out of 150 childrens only 1 student goes to college. It means only 0.6% student studies higher education.
5. From total 150 children, only 69 children studies in school. It means only 46% studies in school.
6. From total 150 children 81 children doesn't go to school. It means 54% students doesn't study in school.

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
